Well the May tournament had another good turnout. We had a total of 22 skiers with an even split of 11 skiers in both the shortline and the non-shortline divisions.

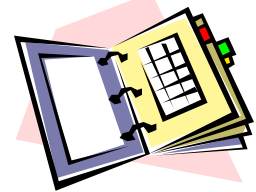
The most improved participant of the day was Conner Torre. After skiing out of the narrow course in March Conner had been working on making more than a couple buoy's on the full course. He not only made all six buoy's at 18mph, he also got 6@20mph and 2@22mph for a score of 16.75! I wish I could see that kind of improvement.

Greg Foerster took first honors in the shortline division with a best pass of 3@36 - 22 off. Bill Schneiderwind again had the best pass of the day with a run of 4.5@34 - 32 off. Donna Cescolini traveled the furthest. She was visiting from Northern California and decided to join us. I hope to see you again Donna!

There may be some question as to how the scoring is being done in the months that the average of two rounds is used. It's really pretty easy. Just add your total buoy's from each round and divide by two. Then compare that number to your average buoy's. It makes for a lot of negative scores because your average is computed based on your best round in each tournament. It also really hurts if you only participate in one round.

Hope to see you all out at the June 17th tournament.

President's Musings

The following is a true confession of a slalom course addict: I went to the river. And not only did I go to "the river", I do believe I had a river experience. And the worst part is that I had an amazing time. Now, this may not be terrible news to most of you, but for a slalom course addict like myself, this presents quite the internal conflict. I am now torn between the adrenaline rush of cutting rope on beautiful slalom sites like Hidden Anchorage or having a ball (no pun intended) on the river doing all sorts of other things behind the boat.

Let me tell y'all a bit about my favorite new ski event. No, I am not talking about slalom, trick or jump. Let's talk about the Ski-Seat: manufactured by Water Sport Industries, the Ski-Seat is designed with two standard size skis connected with steel tubes. A vinyl covered cushion seat is shock-mounted on the tubing and the skier sits 15 inches above the skis. The Ski-Seat, as in standard water skiing, is steered by leaning in the direction the rider wishes to turn. The Ski-Seats patented steering mechanism allows the skier to cut and jump wakes and perform slaloms. I had the best time I've had in the water in years!

It's really cool when you generate a little too much speed, get tossed a bit forward out of the seat as you cross the wakes, point the tips down and go out the front. It is highly recommended that the Ski-Seater be aware of the location of the apparatus relative to the rider's head. In the planning stages are now the Slalom-Seat and Jump-Seat. Both come complete with cup holders and extra padding for boys of all ages.

And the second great event of the day: riding a long board behind a tournament boat. Without a rope. At the robust speed of 9 or 10 mph, the typical tournament boat has quite the whale-tale. Big enough in fact to surf the wakes. Using a 20 foot line on a skyron to deep water start, you catch the "wave" and toss the handle into the boat. Next to Ski-Seating, this is the best time I have had on the water as well. And then, in the final event, why not ski the slalom course on the river. I am now the proud owner of a t-shirt that reads "I ran my opener on the river". Quantities are limited. Call now! Slaloming in the current, along with the jet skiers, party barges, and not-so-straight course is an experience to remember.

The morale of the story: although it's quite easy to get wrapped up in KX factors, personal bests, Grand Prix points and fin settings, water skiing should be an enjoyable hobby. While there may be no feeling as sweet as total harmony with your ski at two ball, this is supposed to be a fun way to spend your time. So, enjoy your time on the water, savor your rides, and while you're at it, save a ride for me.

Collegiate Update

The spring of 2001 proved to be the season of the Tritons. After falling a close second to ASU in the first two tournaments of the season, UCSD fought back winning their first tournament of the year at the Sacramento State Open on Lang Lake, barely edging out UC Davis. Anticipation was high entering the final tournament of the season, the perennial favorite, UCSB Paradise Found on Ski West. Led by junior Tom Stout and Senior Nikki Kennedy, the team overcame a slow slalom start with outstanding performances in the trick and jump events. Nikki placed first in the women's overall setting a personal slalom best. Tom Stout placed a great second in mens overall with 91' jump, more than 15' past his previous best. Not to be outdone by their cross town rivals, SDSU and USD put up strong teams. Freshmen Tara Bonney from USD placed second in women's slalom and Senior Jon Martin placed fourth in men's jump. SDSU captain, Kim Blackwell was the only skier to beat the top three UCSD women in the trick event. As the tournament progressed UCSD found itself in a tight battle with UC Davis. After the last jumper returned to the dock, though, the UCSD Tritons again rose victorious, beating UC Davis by a margin of only 25 points.

Spring 2001 marked one other record in collegiate history as members from the UCSD and SDSU ski teams traveled to College Station, Texas to participate in the NCWSA All-Stars Tournament. Led by Kim Blackwell from SDSU, UCSD skiers Tom Stout, Fred Garcia, Nikki Kennedy, and Robin Hodges returned national champions, helping the Western Region win the All Star tournament.

Finally on a sad note, we would like to say good bye to all of the Collegiate skiers graduating this spring including Harley Wallace, Nikki Kennedy, and Fred Garcia from UCSD, John Martin, Steve Vermucci, and Denise Domaille of USD, and Ryan Thomas from SDSU. Sorry if I missed anyone. Good luck in your new careers.

Calling All Members

It's that time of season again where it's warming up considerably and the day light hours are abundant. It's a great time of year to be hanging out at the bay and drinking beers into the wee hours. Unfortunately for the club, our ski dock is not private (even though we as a club are responsible for its maintenance), and is extremely inviting to those who come out to Fiesta Island to party this time of year. Sometimes these folks don't show much respect for other people's property and leave the dock in a mess. Just the other morning, we found the gang plank to our starting dock missing, and the canopy to the picnic table thrown over the side of the dock. We found the gang plank floating off the shore a ways away from the dock, went and picked it up and pulled the canopy out of the water. I just want to point out that we can not control what some inconsiderate people do to our ski site, but we all as club members and frequent users of the area have the responsibility to maintain the area nonetheless. So, this is just a friendly reminder that if you see that someone has thrashed the ski site in some way, please take the initiative to fix it while you are there. Most of the time it is minor little things and only takes a few moments to remedy the situation. If it is something that you can't fix or if there is considerable damage, please notify an executive member of the club.
