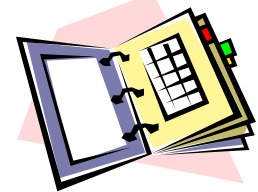
JUMP RAMP UPDATE

Notice anything new in Hidden Anchorage lately? Bill Schneiderwind, Dean Cherry and Eric Dahlgren hauled out the right hand jump side curtain and shored it up to make it safer and functional. Bill, Dean and UCSD's Jason Collins, David Wiens, Tim Odell, Tracie Spies, Peter Mehrhof, Jeff Orr, Alicia Adams and Sean Canaday put in 150 man (and women) hours into the reconstruction of the side curtain and its replacement.

The thing was built for straight on show ski style jumping. We use it for competitive style jumping and it was just flat out unsafe, not to mention an eyesore. The newly constructed side curtain was built to be at a much safer angle for the approach of long distance competitive jumpers. We believe we can use the existing left hand side curtain until the next haul out and refurbishment.

The jump and in particular, the side curtain are not built, nor intended to be used by wakeboards, and club members are encouraged to discourage that activity. There is a new lock on the ramp and members are encouraged to contact the club at the next meeting to learn how to get a key.

SEPTEMBER 22ND, 2002 ARIZONA COLLEGIATE OPEN TRITON BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD

A school record slalom performance by UC San Diego Water Ski Team's Peter Mehrhof spoiled a clean sweep of the slalom event by the defending National Champion Arizona State Sun Devils at their home sites in Queen Creek and Chandler Arizona. The Sophomore from Mammoth Lakes, CA, beat the 9 year old record of 4@32 off set by Duane Gee by running 1 ½ @ 35 off. The Triton sophomore led his team to a second place finish in the event ahead of cross town rival San Diego State.

Marianna Ramirez of Arizona State continued her domination of the women's slalom event skiing to 2.5 @ 38 off in the 100 degree Arizona heat, for a new pending Pacific Conference Record. University of San Diego's Tara Bonney skied 4 @ 22 off to take 6th in the event to be the bright spot in the tournament for the Toreros. San Diego State's Kim Blackwell led her Aztec ladies to a second place slalom team event finish.

With ASU taking the top 4 positions in the men's trick event, Mehrhof added another top five finish for the Tritons. Chad Lowe, however led San Diego State to a second place team finish in the event to mark the first time in 12 years that the Aztecs beat UCSD in the men's trick event. Marianna Ramirez once again led the Lady Devil's ownership of the trick event. Kim Blackwell took 7th to lead the San Diego State women to a second place team event finish.

Kelsey Vasbinder had the Devil fans suggesting the loss of Canadian star Karissa Wedd may be a non-factor punching out an impressive 130 foot leap to take first in women's jump. UCSD's abbreviated women's team and San Diego State tied for second in the event. UCSD Junior Katie Ambrose utilized strong performances in all of the slalom, trick and jump disciplines to place 4th overall individually to lead the Triton women to a third place women's team performance.

Although a tournament win was a virtual lock, the Devil's performance is certain to garner first place votes in next week's NCWSA Coaches Poll. San Diego State took second edging UC San Diego by a slim 25 team points. University of San Diego finished 4th, UC Davis 5th and University of Arizona 6th.

UCSD head coach Bill Schneiderwind commented. "The team skied to solid performances. Peter Mehrhof was due to break the slalom record and is capable of breaking the trick and jump marks as well. The women's team has been substantially depleted by two stars, but Katie Ambrose came to training camp in great shape and skied well in the tournament. Tracie Spies late summer training showed in her strong slalom performance, and will only get better each week. Senior Jeff Orr put up solid scores in slalom and jump.



Freshman David Wiens shows substantial promise in the trick and jump event. The men's jump team really took up the slack of a poor team trick event, in particular Chas Taylor and Tim Odell. My hats off to San Diego State for their first win over the Tritons in 9 years. They are focused and training and they showed it today. We are looking hard on campus to find two to three women to develop into competitive skiers to shore up the women's team."

Next up for UCSD, the Western Regional Championship October 5th and 6th in Bakersfield hosted by the Pacific Conference and UCLA.
