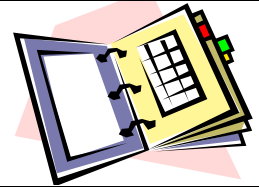

We had 3 skiers into 35' off behind it: Geoff Schmid ran 4 @ 35', 36 mph, to take 1st in the shortline class, edging out nemesis Kelly Hinz who had a score of 1.5 @ 35', 36 mph. Waterski World's own Tom Stravos came down and showed us how to ski on the salt--he got 1 @ 35', 34 mph. Marcus Reynolds tied a PB of 1 @ 28', 36 on his shiny new D3. Connie Morrison became the queen of the non-shortliners running 1 @ 30 mph and beating her average in the process.

After the slalom fun, we got to watch some pretty decent trick skiing by Kelly Hinz, Robin Hodges, and Geoff Schmid.
