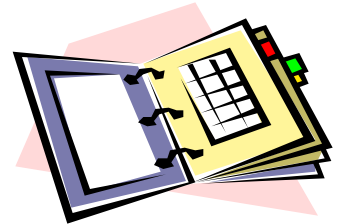
## Presidents Podium

## Where do old trailers go to die!

On Monday January 30th I got this email from Eric Dahlgren: "I saw some crazy-looking dude driving down I-5 this morning towing an empty tournament boat trailer behind his Explorer and he looked a lot like you." Well, it was me. Six years of use in salt water had reduced our boat trailer to a useless hulk. I had already bought a new galvanized Pacific trailer, but what do you do with an old trailer. I had heard stories of late night drops in the desert, but was not sure if I wanted to risk that. After several calls around town, I was pointed to Pacific Steel in National City. The lady on the line was very polite and told me that "Yes, we will take your trailer. Just remove all of the wood first." Two hours of heavy labor with a sledge hammer and I was ready to go. When new, this was a \$4,500 Extreme trailer with blue paint that matched the colors of the boat. It used to be pretty, but no more! I hooked the trailer up and headed south towards the border. If all else failed, I guess there was Mexico! At Pacific Steel, they asked if I wanted to be paid for the trailer. Hmm, someone would pay for this? So I drove onto the scale, waited while the folks high in another building read off the weight and then headed into the yard. I pulled up amidst piles of junk; old washing machines, refrigerators, engine blocks and other unidentifiable junk. I was in the right place, my old trailer would fit it just right here! One of the guys in the yard come over to me and asked what I wanted. "To drop off this trailer" I replied. "Oh no senior, we can't take this trailer" he shot back. "Why not?" I asked. "We can't take the tires, they are hazardous materials." he informed me. "Gosh darn it," I thought (well actually it was a lot stronger than that, more like "What the f... do I do now?"). After some negotiation, I was able to convince them I could get the wheels off in their lot allowing them to take the trailer if I took the wheels home. Of course the lug wrench in my truck did not match the lugs on the trailer. The guys in the yard loaned me their lug wrench and a long pipe to use as a bender bar. Two more hours of hard labor and I was able to remove (mostly by snapping them off, so there was no backup plan at this point!) all of the lugs. With a final kick at the tires, the old trailer fell to her knees on the ground. At the cashier desk, I was given a receipt and \$32.45 cents for the trailer. That paid had a nice lunch at Porkyland's in the Barrio.

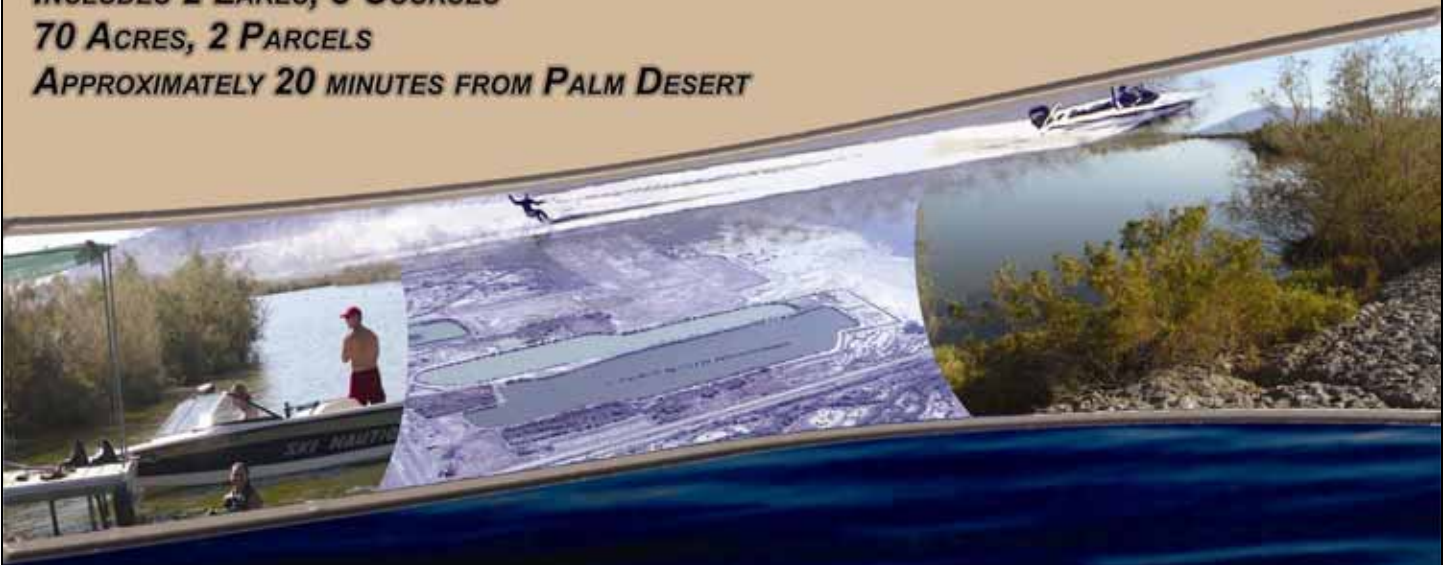
